

JANUARY MEETING REPORT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING THURSDAY, JANUARY 11TH 7:00 PM

QST QST QST... The January meeting of the Stockton-Delta Amateur Radio Club was held at the Stockton Sailing Club, 4980 Buckley Cove, Stockton, CA. The meeting was started at 7 pm by President Charlie Johnson. All officers were present.

There were 20 members and guests in attendance and two on Zoom.

2024 officers were introduced to the club as follows:

Member at Large: Mark Cloud W6SXA

Old Business:

• There was no old business presented.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Per Treasurer Joyce Marciel, the current balance of our club checking account is \$3,796.73

New Business:

- The club was notified that Mark Cloud W6SXA was appointed as Member at Large.
- Joyce presented a budget of \$4,465 for 2024. Bob Officer made the motion to accept and it was seconded by Tim Bernhardson. The motion was carried by members present after a short discussion.
- The members were notified that at least 12 new members needed to be added to the club to prevent an increase in dues next year.
- A motion was made to keep dues at \$25 for an individual, \$30 for a family and \$5 for a
 new ham for the first year. After a discussion Jeff Giampetro made a motion to accept the
 dues and it was seconded by Bob Officer. The motion was carried by members present.
- The creation of a Membership Chair was discussed, and it was decided that Steve Cranny would take the lead due to previous commitments by Kelly Greene.
- The need to change our web host was discussed and the need to find another by the end of the year noted. This was tabled due to multiple club events coming up and will be set for a future date.
- Joni KN6WVX gave an update on the Pedaling Paths event on February 24th. Sign-ups are progressing and it may be a large turnout.

Volunteers for event chairpersons was discussed. There are several openings and everyone
is encouraged to participate. The Ham Cram scheduled for January 27th may not happen if
more people do not sign up. Bob Officer will speak with the sponsor of this event next
week.

Presentation:

Mark W6SXA gave a presentation on the 2m and 70cm band plans for Northern California that was quite informative.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:33 pm and the next scheduled meeting is set for February 8^{th} at 7 pm at the Stockton Sailing Club.







PRESIDENT'S CORNER

This year in Amateur Radio should be a very good year! The current sunspot cycle is predicted to have its maximum this year and to be very active for the next two years. I encourage anyone with a yearning for HF to get an HF station and put up an antenna for the HF bands. Simple wire antennas or vertical antennas will do better with the increased sunspots and getting a taste of the DX conditions may encourage you to get a better wire, vertical or beam antenna up.

If you have a Technician class license, you may consider upgrading by studying at a Ham Cram, Ham-U and/or with a license manual from the ARRL or other sources and have more bands with HF privileges to work with. This year may be the year you to learn or improve your Morse code ability to help work more stations. Check with other hams to get help with your station, antenna, license, or Morse code. Running new modes (for you) would also be a way to take advantage of the HF band conditions. There are plenty of members of our club who would be glad to be your Elmer.

Our club has several upcoming events that we support with radio communications. We need volunteers. This is a great way to exercise our abilities to work in a public service capacity—just what Amateur Radio was set up to do! The Pedaling Paths Bike Ride to support the Community Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired will be on the 24th of February. We still need volunteer

Ham radio operators to man checkpoints and SAG vehicles—you can sign up on the W6SF Web site on the Event Sign-Up sheet.

At the January 2024 club meeting, our annual budget was approved. We need all members to pay dues and encourage or recruit other non-member hams to join—this is needed to improve our financial situation, help man club activities, and increase the friendship/fellowship at our club activities. Talk it up with your ham buddies who are not members of our club.

The club also needs to identify and locate club owned equipment as a logistics effort so that the club can plan to use it in our activities. Please check your ham shacks for club equipment and bring the information to one of our club meetings. If you need help doing this, I'm sure we will be able to find someone to assist you in this endeavor.

15th ANNUAL PEDALING PATHS BIKE RIDE IS COMING SOON FEBRUARY 24, 2024 YOUR HELP IS NEEDED!

Pedaling Paths is more than just something we help out with. Your Stockton-Delta Amateur Radio Club is the hosting sponsor of this event.

Club members have been hard at work getting ready for the event. Now is the time to start organizing volunteers. We've been securing corporate sponsorships (Comcast is contributing \$2000 again this year), and taking in the registrations for the 2023 event. Thanks especially to Annie N6ACL, Joyce K6QBQ and Joni KN6WVX who have been the driving force getting things together.

Pedaling Paths is an annual fund raiser to support activities for The Community Center for the Blind and Visually Impaired (www.ccvbi.org) Early registrations have been coming in for weeks along with donations and offers for sponsorship. Everything indicates this will be a very good and very busy event!

This year we will staff operators at Rest Stops in Linden, Farmington, and Milton. We anticipate supporting as many as 5 SAG (Service and Gear) wagons with communications and vehicle location utilizing APRS. We will be coordinating other volunteers and making sure everyone is checked in – proper waivers are signed, and everyone stays safe! This is the second ride since COVID shut down the event after the 2020 ride. If you remember last year we were hampered by rain and very cold temperatures the morning of the ride which kept numbers down. This year we are optimistic that the weather will be great and we will have a much larger ride! We will be using our "Central Dispatch" phone number of 209-227-0724 (227- 0SAG) Each rider will be given this number to call directly to the Net Control Station in the event of an emergency or break down. Using APRS in each of the SAG Wagons, Net Control will be able to track the locations of SAGs and 'dispatch' the closest SAG Wagon to the reported break-down or other incident.

After the ride, riders and volunteers can share a delicious meal provided by DeVinci's Deli in Linden. We need you! Sign up today on the <u>Event Sign-Up</u> page of the website. Pedaling Paths isn't just about radio anymore – the club is investing in the community and the CCBVI.









LUSD WORLD OF STEAM SATURDAY MARCH 23rd 10:00 AM - 2:00 PM

The club has been invited again to be a participant in the World of STEAM (Science Technology Engineering Art and Math) on Saturday March 23rd at Lincoln High School. The event runs from 10:00 AM to 2:00PM

We will be setting up starting at 8:00 AM. The club will offer interactive displays of Morse Code, by Bob K6DGQ and anyone with straight key or paddles and code practice oscillators would be welcome to bring them for kids to try their Morse Code skills.

We will be on the air with HF/VHF/UHF as well. We will be demonstrating WINLink email, packet, EMCOMM, HF Radio on FT-8. We will also have a demo set-up for SDR radio.

We want to demonstrate Echolink and DMR and show how kids can connect with like minded kids in a safe Amateur Radio environment around the world.

Dave WB6TOU is working on a balloon launch, and we've asked Monte Diablo Amateur Radio Club if they can join us again and bring their ATV truck set up and demonstrate Amateur Digital Television.
